

The Longest Day of Golf

A Benefit Fundraiser for the Autism Society of Larimer County

“Four Friends FORE Autism”



On June 29th 2009, four men will set out to endure 16 hours of “speed” style golf with the goal of completing at least 200 holes in one day!

It is easy to help! The Longest Day of Golf, follows simple plan. Participants collect pledges from donors to raise money to benefit the Autism Soceity of Larimer County.

Pledges can be made per completed hole or a flat pledge basis.

What is the LONGEST DAY OF GOLF?

At the break of dawn on June 29th, Matthew Martin Scott Schilling, Luke Schilling, and Ryan Peterson will start swinging toward the goal of playing 200 or more holes of golf in one day. This challenging

endurance event will take them about 16 hours to complete and will cover over 44 miles of golf course. This is no walk in the park. Each player will scramble from hole to hole on the Collindale golf course from sunup to sundown in order to raise as much money as possible for our local autism community. Pledges made on a per hole basis will be determined by holes completed by the entire group.

Where are the funds going?

The Autism Society of Larimer County, is a 501 c(3) non-profit, volunteered organization dedicated to the advocacy, support, and education of those living and loving on the autism spectrum.

The fundraising for this event will go toward providing training and scholarships for the Exceptional Sitters Program. Through the fundraising endeavors the ASLC would like to provide free training of individuals

interested in becoming certified in care of children on the autism spectrum. Training includes CPR, First Aid and instruction by Board Certified Behavioral Analysis Catherine Bladow. Due to the cost of raising a child with autism many parents are in need of financial assistance for sitter care. This is where scholarship money will go.

How can I participate in our pledge program for the Longest Day of Golf?

Collect Pledges

Set a goal for yourself and make a list of everyone you can think of to ask. Estimate how much each person must give to reach your goal. Ask for the specific amount that will attain your goal. Ask others for suggestions of who else you might ask.

You can participate in the fundraising efforts of the Longest Day of Golf by inviting your family, friends, co-workers, neighbors, business associates, fellow students, teachers, local vendor, merchants, your doctor,

dentist, lawyer, broker, real estate agent, or just about anyone! Ask in person or via phone, email, letter, or faxes. Pledges can be made in either a flat amount for the event or challenge them to pledge per hole completed.

Matching Contributions!

Remember that if you or your friend work for a company that matches donation you could DOUBLE your donations by applying a Company Match.

To save yourself from having to go back a second time to your donors, we strongly recommend that you collect any donations made on a flat pledge basis at the same time you ask. For those who pledge per completed hole you may collect donations after the event. Keep track of your donors on your pledge form and turn the form in by July 6th, so we can send a personal thank-you letter to the donors.

What if people want to give cash?

It is the safest and best for record-keeping that you convert all cash received to checks or money orders. If you are able, the safest option is to send a personal check covering the full amount, along with the corresponding donation form, to the Autism Society of Larimer County. If this is not possible you can arrange for donation funds and pledge sheets to be picked up by an ASLC member.

Are donations tax deductible?

Your gift is tax deductible to the extent allowed by law. The Autism Society of Larimer County is a registered 501(c)3 organization through the Autism Society of America. Our tax ID number is 20-4482792

Who should checks be made out to?

Please ask your supporters to make checks payable to Autism Society of Larimer County or ASLC (for short).
